
Your district audiologist is "HEAR" to support in a multitude of ways.

An educational audiologist (EdAud):

- serve students with hearing loss and auditory needs
- support teams on how to accommodate their students' hearing loss in the classroom
- identifies acoustical modifications for the classroom
- makes sure that hearing assistive equipment, needed to access the curriculum, is fitted and consistently works
- Provides direct/indirect auditory and self advocacy development.

IDEA requires that the equipment is functioning every day. Equipment includes the child's personal hearing aids or cochlear implants, as well as school provided Hearing Assistance Technology (HAT).

An EdAud is the only professional that can select the appropriate HAT, fits it on the student, and make sure that the school-owned equipment will not cause additional hearing loss.

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Madeline's Law: Hearing Aids for Kids

Did you know that children's hearing aids are considered "cosmetic" by insurance companies. We need to change this! HB 152 (Ohio's hearing aid bill) passed favorably in the Ohio House in Jun 2023. The bill needs to pass favorably in the Senate. It has been assigned to the Senate Insurance Committee.
