PBIS Tier I Overview and Refresher (PreK-12)

Audience: New members of PBIS teams, new district administrators, PBIS team members who have not been trained in Tier I, anyone needing a refresher in the Tier I framework.

PBIS is a framework or approach for assisting school personnel in adopting and organizing evidencebased behavioral interventions into an integrated continuum that enhances academic and social behavior outcomes for all students. PBIS IS NOT a packaged curriculum, scripted intervention, or manualized strategy. PBIS IS a prevention-oriented way for school personnel to: (a) organize evidencebased practices (b) improve their implementation of those practices (c) maximize academic and social behavior outcomes for students. PBIS supports the success of ALL students (PBIS.org).

Participants will:

- Identify the rationale for implementing PBIS
- Understand aspects of the PBIS framework
- Understand overarching expectations
- Understand a reinforcement system and systematic plan for error correction
- Understand a data management system to monitor behaviors
- Identify resources for PBIS at the state and national level

PBIS Tier II

Some students will respond to the Tier I level of support but will still exhibit some specific difficulties. These students may be demonstrating academic and/or behavioral deficits that will require more Intensive supports. Tier II interventions can be effective in working with students at-risk for academic and/or behavioral concerns. **February 5, 2020**

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) Training

This training will teach building teams to create and implement the Universal Tier (Tier 1) of a PBIS framework. Building teams will learn the rationale for implementing this framework. In addition, teams will develop school-wide expectations which will be used in their buildings. Teams will also develop a system of reinforcement, as well as data systems which will inform decision making and help monitor behaviors at the building level. This workshop is a 4 part series, in which teams are required to attend all 4 sessions.
