
The Mission of the TOPS program is to provide students with the opportunity to learn independence, academics, and life skills based on each student's individual needs in a safe learning environment.

Our Program

The TOPS Program uses functional life skill approach while incorporating Ohio's New Learning Standards. Students will gain independence in the TOPS Living Lab, an apartment-styled classroom located on site, in which students will learn life skills:

- Self-care
- Self Advocacy
- Planning and creating meals
- Housekeeping skills
- Financial literacy

Students explore various job opportunities during daily vocational lab. Skills are then generalized to unpaid school jobs. As the student makes progress in their job development they will be placed, with support, in the community completing internships leading to paid positions.
